Sochacki Park

Sub-Watershed Study and Water Quality Improvement Project Summer 2022 Update

Three Rivers Park District, in coordination with Golden Valley, Robbinsdale, and the Bassett Creek Watershed Management Commission, is nearing completion of a sub-watershed assessment for



Sochacki Park to identify potential water quality improvements for its wetland ponds. These efforts were designed to better understand the status of the wetlands and to identify improvements for ecological health and aesthetics, along with recreation and education opportunities.

A final report from the study will provide recommendations, including best management practices (BMPs) and in-pond management options, planning level cost estimates, permitting needs, cost/benefit evaluation and treatment priorities based on ability to reduce pollutants and potential to improve water quality.

The final report is expected by the steering team in August and will be shared with the Sochacki Park Joint Powers Board in September. Next steps will be guided by the final assessment report and implementation will require partner collaboration and grant funding opportunities to meet the long-term goals for the plan.

Project Timeline

August 2022

Sochacki Sub-watershed Assessment Steering Committee reviews final report and discusses recommendations.

September 2022

Report is presented to the Sochacki Park Joint Powers Board.

Fall 2022 through 2023

Implementation plan is developed by partners and grant applications are submitted.
