HELP BY PATROLLING

- Park Trails
- Horse Trails
- Regional Trails
- Hyland Hills Host (on foot at alpine area)
- District Wide Special Events

QUALIFICATIONS

- Minimum age 16 years (18 years for horse patrol unless accompanied by parent who is also a patroller)
- Good physical fitness
- Good customer service skills
- Intermediate skill level in chosen mode of patrolling

REQUIREMENTS

- Completion of all required training
- Criminal background check
- Provide own recreational equipment or horse

COMMITMENT

- 30 hours per year
- One year or more

BENEFITS

- Pass fees waived while patrolling.
- Excellent training, valuable experience, and fun!
- Volunteer Fun Pass which provides access to park facilities with fees at a discount or free; depending upon the facility and hours of volunteer service.

FEES

- AHA CPR \$35
- First Aid \$25
- Course fees include mask and book.
- Needs based scholarships available.
- Patrollers are reimbursed fees paid for Three Rivers classes after they complete 30 hours of patrol service within 12 months of training.

- American Heart Association (AHA) CPR (4 hours)
- AHA First Aid (4 hours)
- Bloodborne Pathogen training- online
- Patrol Simulation (2.5 hours)

- Summer Season All-Patrol Meeting (1.5 hours)

REGISTRATION

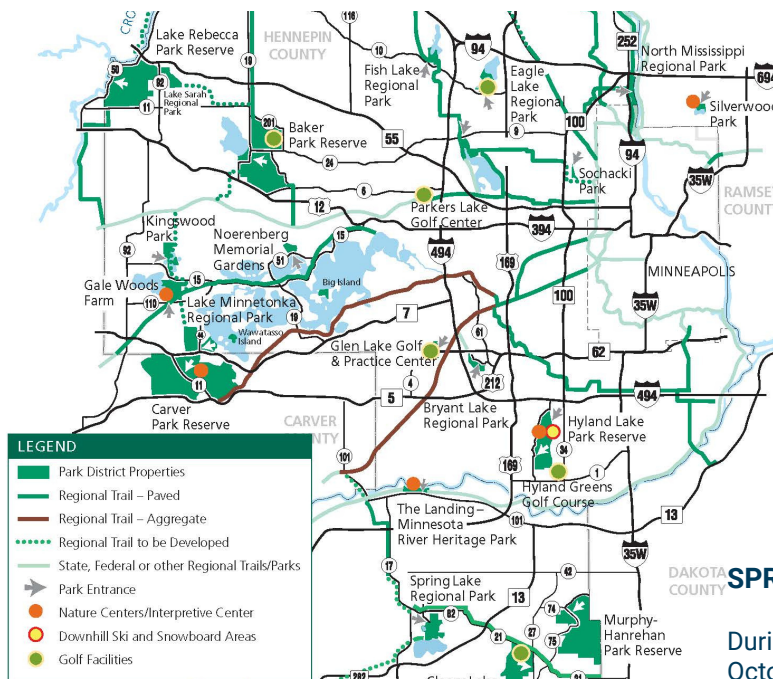

Three Rivers Park District is a natural resources-based park system that manages park reserves, regional parks, regional trails, and special-use facilities in the Twin Cities metropolitan area. Three Rivers offers activities for every season, as well as programs for nature, recreation, history, art and farm education.

The mission of Three Rivers Park District is to promote environmental stewardship through recreation and education in a natural resources-based park system. Three Rivers owns and operates over 27,000 acres and serves millions of visitors annually.



Patrollers choose from a variety of locations and year-round activities based on their preference and skill level.

SPRING/SUMMER/FALL PATROL LOCATIONS

During the non-snow season (approximately May 1 – October 31), patrollers are needed on a variety of trails, as well as at races and events. Volunteers patrol on bike, foot, horse, and in-line skates; depending on trail designations or facility needs.

WINTER PATROL LOCATIONS

When the snow flies, patrollers are needed at winter recreation areas on cross-country ski trails; selected snowshoe, walking or multi-use trails; winter horse trails; and at events, programs or races. Ski volunteers should choose a site within their ability level.
